(1) Hi! So here we are once again. It's been a long year full of all kinds of stuff, but I'd never miss Madrid Popfest. What about the **PROGRAMME**? Is it similar to last year's

Exactly. We have refined some things, but the plan is still similar to previous years: Friday and Saturday night shows in Sala Galileo, and *vermú* session on Saturday at noon in the Nave de Terneras. The only change this year is that we bring you one more group for the same price.

Fun guaranteed. Hugging friends, hours and hours of indiepop, bands that we want to see and other bands and people that you will discover and be surprised.

You already know that, except for reasons of force majeure, we are incredibly rigorous with the schedules and until now we have complied every year. So, don't be late. This year there'll be a lot of people, so, to be comfortable, we recommend to arrive with enough time to the venues.

(2) Lots of people? Are there any **TICKETS** left?

We want you to be comfortable in the venues, so we respect the attendance limit in a very strict way. We even sell less than allowed for you to be all better dancing or sitting or doing what you like to do during the shows. We don't judge those who have decided to watch the shows through the screen of their mobile phone. Well, we don't like those who speak ignore the shows and disturb those who want to hear them.

Coming back to tickets, a few days before the festival, there are still some two-day tickets and day tickets for sale, but not too many. If they run out before the festival, and we don't sell tickets at the door, we will

notify you through the usual channels. The price is 35,50 euros for two-day passes and 21 euros for day tickets.

And if you can't go to Galileo, you can always come to the shows at Nave de Terneras, which, like last year, are free until the capacity is complete (which is quite big). Or to the DJs after shows, which can be accessed with the two-day tickets or day tickets, or with specific tickets with the usual conditions of Sala Galileo, that is, 12 euros with a drink. DJs playing the best of indiepop and more, to dance until late. Not You can't enjoy something like that every day.

(3) Hey! Yes, I'm interested in the **DRINKS**. What can you say about that?

We have reached an agreement with Galileo so that, during the whole festival, two drinks are served for 14 euros or two beers for 8 euros. Talk to each other and get a couple of drinks, even if it's someone you did not know before. Last year there were some queues to buy tickets for this offer, but this year we tried to avoid them.

And in Terneras prices are the same as last year. We try to make them as popular as possible, but it is true that all the financing of the Terneras event comes from your consumptions. Here we have to say that you should drink with responsibility or you risk missing the night shows!

We have also tried to have enough supply of gluten-free beers, non-alcoholic drinks and so on, however, if you need something contact someone in the organization and let us know. We'll do our best

(4) Well, I'll probably drink. So now I got the picture of the two **VENUES**, but last year someone guide me there and I'd probably get lost.

Find below some maps. The venues are a bit far one of the other to go and walk back on Saturday, although there are so many metro stations near Galileo that it does not take too long to get from one to the other. From Legazpi, using line 3 you get to Argüelles or Moncloa very fast, although the closes stations are Islas Filipinas or Canal, and then you can change in Sol.

(5) OK, I'll call you if I get lost. Talking about getting lost, what it's not clear to me is if in your festival, as many others, I'd have to decide between bands playing at the same time and I have to miss many bands I like, will this be the case?

No no. The bill is linear and there is more than enough time to reach the venues. Just to remind you that on Friday, in the early hours, there will be a lot of people trying to the Galileo, so putting wristbands may be a slow process. Arrive early.

Leaving that aside, if you miss something it is because you have decided to. It is true that we have not programmed times for meals or dinners, but Madrid has a thousand places to eat delicious things at any time of the day or night.

(6) So WRISTBANDS again this year, right?

Exactly! But there's no need to wear it the resto f the year once the festival is over. Wristbands will also be in shinny colours this year.

(7) I brought **CHILDREN** last year and this time they also want to bring the dob, how could we do it?

How cute. As in any other music show in Madrid, under-age can go to the venues during the shows. Obviously, they're not allowed to drink, and it's recommendable to wear ear plugs. After the shows, they have to leave, since they are not allowed during DJs.

Regarding dogs, unfortunately we have not achieved to bring them to any of our shows. And we don't think they'll like all that people and loud noises. It's better they wait for you to come back home early in the morning to take them for a walk and then sleep better.

(9) If I love the festival so much that I what to wear Popfest's **MERCHANDISING** during my travels in summer holidays, where can I buy it?

In Sala Galileo we will have an indie fair with our stand and some friends from cool record companies. In ours you can buy the merchandising from previous editions and also new things that we have done this year. But if you are too lazy to carry things or you want to ask for something in particular, you can always write to us at info@madridpopfest.com and we are sure that we will reach you wherever you want.

The sale of merchandising also helps us to finance the festival. Like last year, we will make an offer for fans who want everything. Watch out to all our offers of various magnets and badges and the Fan Pack with special price! But especially to our fanzine.

(10) Yeah! Last year's **FANZINE** was amazing, with that look of old note pads.

Thanks! You can still buy some of them in our stand. But wait until you see the new one, in the line of this year's festival image, focused on not so well knows representative buildings of Madrid, some of which no longer exist (sadly). We are very happy with the results.

(11) You've convinced me, I'll take a look at the **STANDS** and I'm sure I'll grab something

Sure you will. The bands that participate in the festival always bring us their stuff that we sell in our stand, and you can also greet and buy material to our friends from Meritorio, Kocliko, Bobo Integral / Shore Leave Store, Jabalina, Aplasta tus gafas de pasta/ Discos del Tesoro, Disco FUP, Caballito Records / Fikasound or Málaga Popfest ... This year it seems that more labels than ever have decided to participate, and the quality of the material is awesome, as always.

(12) Last year it was cool that **GENDER NEUTRAL TOILETS**, is that also the case this year?

Yes. It was suggested a couple of years ago by our Friends The Spook School and we thought it was a good idea, so we do it in every event we organize. You can choose between any of the WC as you please. I'm sure that the audience understands it and wants to ensure that every person has the right to use them comfortably. Help us.

(13) Although the forecast predicts good weather, in chills at night, is there a **CLOAKROOM** in the venues?

In Galileo there is a cloakroom. In Nave de Terneras you will have to leave your stuff around and make mountains for the kids to (safely) climb and better see the shows.

(14) And what can I do on Sunday 24th?

Eat healthy, drink water, love yourself and make exercise.
